

#### The Marist Monk of Tibherine

French Trappist monk Jean-Pierre Schumacher died on Sunday, November 21st, in Morocco, age 97. Along with one other monk, frère Jean-Pierre survived the kidnapping and brutal killing of the seven monks from the monastery in Tibhirine, Algeria, in 1996.

Frère Jean-Pierre started his religious life as a Marist: he did his novitiate in la Neylière, and was finally professed in the Society of Mary in 1951. In 1953 he was ordained to the priesthood in Ste-Foy. After reconsidering his vocation, he entered the Cistercian Abbey of Notre-Dame de Timadeuc in 1957, and arrived as a monk in Algeria in 1967. Four years after the martyrdom of his confreres, Jean-Pierre moved to Morocco, becoming prior of the Trappist community of Notre-Dame de l'Atlas, where he continued to testify in prayer and silence of the love of Christ.
