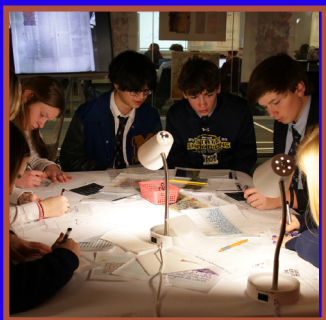

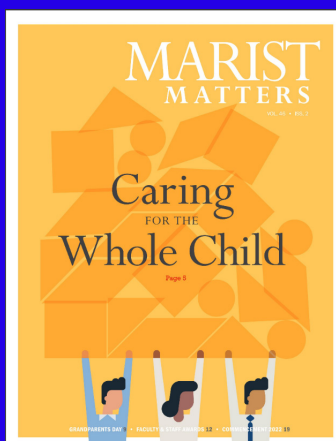

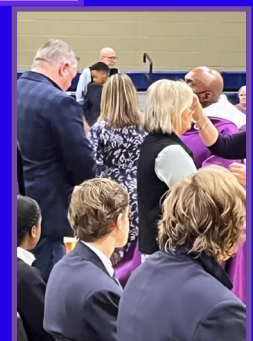
Members of the Junior and Senior classes recently attended Emmaus 196. During this retreat students had the chance to grow and strengthen their relationships with God and one another!

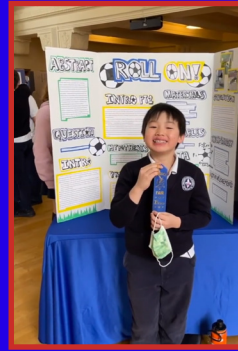
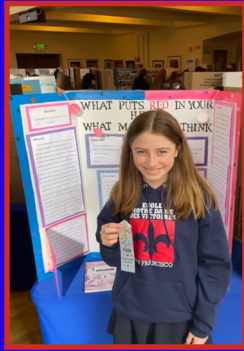
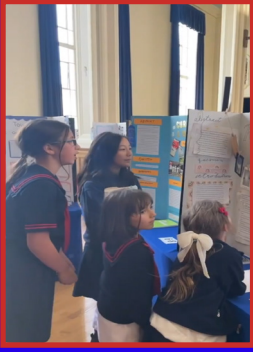


NDV Mardi Gras Celebration!



On Ash Wednesday the NDV school community gathered for a school Liturgy that centered on the call to prayer, fasting, and alms giving.

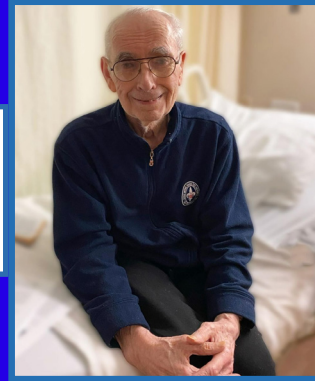




Science Fair

End of a 70 Year School Ministry

As part of the prioritization of ministries in the province, the provincial administration after appropriate consultations, chose to end the seventy-year long commitment to education at St John's College, Cawaci, Fiji at the end of 2022.

St John's college was first established in 1894 by the Marist brothers. The first St John was closed in 1951 and was relocated to another site in the main island of Fiji. Bishop Foley then rebuilt Cawaci and in 1952 re-established St John's college for boys only under the care of the Society of Mary.

On the 28th of January 2023 the ex-scholars and parents gathered at the college to fare-well and to acknowledge with gratitude the contributions of the Marists towards the establishment, development and above all the education of the youths of the school in the last 70 years.

Meeting with the confreres of the Omnes Gentes Mission in Parramatta

After completing the visitation in the District of Australia, Fr. John Larsen, Superior General of the Society of Mary, met with our omnes gentes community in Hunters Hill for one morning of prayer and conversation. This omnes gentes community is based in the diocese of Parramatta, Sydney, Australia. It is an international Marist mission community praying and working in parochial, pastoral and educational care, mostly among migrants. The time together began with an extended period of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament and concluded with a celebration of the Eucharist. The conversation centered around what "communion for mission" means in this particular context and, specifically, how our unique Marist charism shapes our life and mission in the local diocese. Overall, our confreres are very happy with the way the mission has begun and the direction it is taking, in spite of the many challenges of a new Marist venture.
