## Recipient of the 2023 Rev. Louis J. Luzbetak, SVD Award



Ken Johnson-Mondragon, a former Marist, has been awarded the 2023 Rev. Louis J. Luzbetak, SVD award for Exemplary Church Research, named for Georgetown University's Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) first executive director for significant lifetime contributions to research on the Catholic Church.

Ken's approach to research was informed by four years as a parish youth minister and pastoral associate. From 1999 to 2015, he was director of the National Research and Resource Center for Hispanic Youth and Young Adult Ministry with the Institute Fe y Vida, a national Catholic formation institute. From 2015 to 2017 he was director of Latino Research and Development for RCL Benziger, one of the country's oldest and largest publishers of Catholic faith formation resources. Under appointment by the Secretariat for Cultural Diversity in the Church of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, from 2017 to 2021, he was coordinator of research for the V Encuentro, where his skill at gathering, analyzing, and reporting on data from the four-year national consultation process produced research reports at the diocesan, regional, and national levels to inform a variety of stakeholders of its effect on the life of the Catholic Church in the U.S. Ken's distinguished service in a succession of positions of increasing importance led to his appointment in 2022 as the first director of pastoral engagement for the California Catholic Conference.

Ken has been the author or co-author of dozens of academic articles and book chapters, and in 2007, St. Mary's Press published his edited book, Pathways of Hope and Faith among Hispanic Teens. His USCCB efforts resulted in the bilingual publication of Proceedings and Conclusions of the V National Encuentro of Hispanic/ Latino Ministry. His other awards include the Leadership Award of the 2008 National Catholic Network de Pastoral Juvenil Hispana, and in 2015 the Catholic Press Award for his best book review of Young Catholic America: Emerging Adults In, Out of, and Gone from the Church, by Christian Smith and others. On October 21st, Dr. Linda Lehmil, Executive Director of Reach for Excellence and Ms. Teresa Enriquez Texis, Hispanic Initiative Coordinator for Reach for Excellence held a workshop with 8<sup>th</sup> grade parents to discuss high school options and the admissions process. Dr. Lehmil and Ms. Enriquez Texis reviewed individual steps and deadlines for eight independent schools as well as local charter and magnet programs.

Parents learned about everything from creating a Ravenna account, the admissions portal used by the Atlanta Association of Independent Schools, to registering for open houses, as well as each school's transportation options. The Reach for Excellence team also provided contacts and information for financial aid applications.

Reach for Excellence's mission includes not just preparing students for the rigors of college preparatory high schools and programs, but also ensuring that their families have the tools and resources that they need for the journey.

The current Reach for Excellence scholars are a talented and diverse group. Each Saturday, they come from four counties across the metro area, with 69% living in DeKalb County. A little more than half of the students are female and over 90% are eligible for free or reduced lunch. Currently, 48% of our students identify as Hispanic, 45% as Black, 6% as Asian, and 1% as other. Impressively, over 90% of our students speak a language in addition to English.

On October 22<sup>nd</sup>, the OLPH community celebrated the Feast of Sto. Niño del Mundo. The veneration of Sto. Niño (the Holy Child) has been closely incorporated in Philippine Catholicism since the country's discovery by explorer Ferdinand Magellan in 1521. On the baptism of the reigning chief into Christianity, Magellan gifted a statue of the Child Jesus to the reigning ruler, Rajah Humabon. To this day, the statue is the oldest Christian artifact in the Philippines. The image, which became one of the most venerated cultural icons, has since then been replicated in different parts of the country and given other titles, one of which is Sto. Niño del Mundo.

Sto. Niño del Mundo (Holy Child of the World) depicts the Holy Child in imperial attire, holding a scepre on one hand and a golden globus cruciger on the other.
