Alumni Speakers Focus on Service and Justice at MLK Day Assembly






Marist School Campus Minister Mr. Nik Rodewald brings a wealth of passion and inspiration to Marist through his role in Campus Ministry. Serving as the liturgical music coordinator, Nazareth retreat moderator, sports team chaplains moderator, and teacher of Marist Way and Faith and Reason classes, Mr. Rodewald's journey at Marist began as a seminarian with the Society of Mary before he moved into a lay employee role. This transition equipped him with a unique perspective to his diverse responsibilities.

Now in his fourth year at Marist, Mr. Rodewald is at the forefront of building the vocations program. Collaborating with teachers and implementing all-school programming, he equips students with the knowledge needed to discern and follow God's calling. Recently, he partnered with College Counseling to integrate the VIA Character Strengths Survey into theology classes. This initiative empowers students to better understand themselves and determine their callings both within and beyond the Marist community. His collaborative leadership significantly contributes to the mission of Marist School.

"I'm inspired by the way that our community practices being hidden and unknown," Mr. Rodewald says. "Our students accomplish a lot in the classroom and on the field. Yet, as soon as you dig a little deeper, you'll find that so many members of our community are most passionate about the things they do behind the scenes, whether that's volunteering at Trinity House or a night shelter, supporting Reach for Excellence or Centro Hispano Marista, creating beautiful art, working for sustainability, or witnessing to the human dignity of migrants and refugees. It's inspiring to be a part of a community like that."

The only way to hear the Spirit's voice is to listen for it, to put aside our own agendas and truly listen to what everyone has to share. This is a real chance for bishops to hear what their faithful feels and for the faithful to hear what issues their priests face. It is an opportunity for all involved to grow in the Spirit"

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

Fr Kevin, the author of many albums of songs, hymns and reflections, is known not only for his musical talents but as a gentle, ever-cheerful and devoted guide and pastor. Prior to his retirement he had been parish priest of Holy Name of Mary parish, Hunters Hill-Woolwich, NSW.
