On March 8th, in recognition of International Women's Day, the school community at Colegio San Jose honored and thanked all the women who are part of the educational community.





Synodality Corner ...

The Synod on Synodality is a three-year process of listening and dialogue that began in 2021. The first session of the Synod in Rome concluded at the end of October 2023.

Until the next session begins, let's remember some highlights of this first Synod session from Pope Francis.

"Pope Francis makes it very clear that the listening we are called to do in the Synod process is listening to the Holy Spirit. "If the Spirit is not present," he says, "there will be no Synod." Our task is to get out of our own way and make ourselves open to what the Spirit is trying to do in and through us. We come to this process full of convictions and opinions. But are we so sure that our convictions are correct that we have pushed away the voice of the Spirit/ The synodal process works only when we are all open to the Spirit, and the first step is really listening to one another."



INTERNATIONAL FORMATION REVIEW COMMITTEE

The General Council has established a Committee to carry out a review of our International Formation.



The committee is composed of:

• **Fr Martin McAnaney sm** (Chair) from the province of Europe. Martin has been the Provincial Superior of Europe and has a large experience to work in administration and formation, in an international context.

• **Sr Jane O'Carroll sm:** she is current Unit leader of the Marist Sisters in New Zealand. Jane has been Superior General of the Marist Sisters, and has vast experience in Marist formation and administration.

• **Fr Samuel Agcararca svd**: Rector of the Divine Word School of Theology, Tagaytay. He teaches there and at the University of Santo Tomas in Manila. He has a doctorate in missiology and specializes in anthropology and interculturality.

The committee has been asked to focus, amongst other things, on:

- how well are we forming our students as Marists, in the Church, in this current challenging world.
- evaluating the International Marist Formation Houses in the light of the pillars described in our International Directory of Initial Formation, i.e. human, spiritual, intellectual, pastoral and intercultural formation.
- Marist religious life and spirituality in the formation houses.

A first meeting of the committee took place last week by zoom. The work of the committee will include visitations of our two International formation houses and interviews with people involved in formation, which will include also some former formators and students.

It is hoped that the committee will be able to give their report and recommendations to the General Council by the beginning of next year, and that it will submitted for consideration at the General Chapter in 2025.
