An Emotional and Educational Day at NDP

West Bloomfield, Michigan resident and Holocaust survivor Irene Miller recently met with and spoke to students in the middle school and upper school as part of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) programming for Jewish-American Heritage Month. Miller's book, "Into No Man's Land," details her family's escape from the horrors of Holocaust to end up in a frozen field of "no man's land" at a Siberian labor camp in an impoverished village in Uzbekistan before making her way to Israel, and ultimately, to the United States. It is a story of courage, determination, perseverance

and the power of the human spirit.

Strangers No Longer (SNL) is a network of Circles of Support formed in Catholic parishes, congregations and immigrant communities to support immigrant neighbors and to advocate for a comprehensive and humane immigration policy. Named after a pastoral letter written by Bishops about immigration, the organization is motivated by Jesus' call to welcome the stranger - a call that has been echoed by Pope Francis and church leaders throughout time.

Food Parcels for Migrants in New Zealand

On April 20th, the St. Anne's community entrusted Alex and Cecilia with the contents of donated food baskets. Alex and Cecilia belong to a small Christian community called "La Familia", based in central Auckland, New Zealand, that serves as a surrogate family for Latin American students and recent immigrants from a variety of South American countries. "La Familia" provides consistent friendship and fellowship as well as practical and spiritual help. Alex and Cecilia help deliver the food donations from St. Anne's to the migrants. The migrants, some who have small children, are in a precarious situation living in the center of Auckland, trying to find work, pay rent and scratch for food. Agencies that had hired them went broke and the migrants have visas for specific work only.







