

## BE MARY'S PRESENCE in the world

Marists are people who are called to do the work of Mary in her name and with her spirit. We are a family of many branches — priests, brothers, sisters and lay people.

## the spirit of Mary ...

Mary's life was one of prayer and action. God's will was her first concern; God's interests were her only interests. Mary was the first disciple of Jesus.

Now, she is a compassionate and merciful mother to us all. She is all embracing; no one is excluded from her motherly love.

Mary fulfills her mission of bringing Jesus to us by teaching us to live a simple life of service, hidden and unknown, a life of humility, poverty, self-denial and ardent love of neighbor.

Those who receive the spirit of Mary also are sent on a mission to bring Jesus to others.

Since Vatican II there has been a rediscovery of the role of the laity as evangelizers. Lay people have a unique opportunity to evangelize the family, the neighborhood and the workplace.

Lay Marists evangelize by bringing a Marian presence to the Church and to the world, by making the whole world Marist.



#### the whole world Marist...

Evangelizing the whole world is an immense task. It calls for the involvement and gifts of all.

The Marist Founder, Father Jean-Claude Colin, taught that lay people are called to partnership in mission with priests and religious. Marist Laity, as individuals and as groups, have often worked with Marist priests, brothers and sisters in bringing the Gospel to the world.

Marist Lay groups take on a diversity of structures, works, traditions and names, depending on circumstances and interests. The groups are called The Marist Laity, The Marist Way or the Third Order of Mary.

Taking on the mind and heart of Mary is quite a challenge. How do we begin?

We can pray, work and study with others who are answering the call to serve as Marists. We can read and ponder Scripture and Marist literature. We may even start a new group.

The place to be Marist is where we are; the time is now.
