Marist School's Share the Journey club honored the life of Pope Francis during their recent annual pilgrimage walk to Clarkston, Georgia. Share the Journey was founded at Marist in 2018 in response to Pope Francis' global campaign promoting solidarity with migrants and refugees. This year's walk began at St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Decatur, Georgia. Along the nearly six-mile journey, students paused at designated stops to share prayers and reflections from Pope Francis centered on the struggles of those forced to flee their homes. One meaningful stop was at the <u>Amani Women Center</u> in Clarkston, where founder Doris Mukango spoke to the group about how the center supports immigrant and refugee women through initiatives like the Amani Sewing Academy and ESL Buddies. Share the Journey presented Ms. Mukango with a donation raised through the club's fundraising efforts this year. The pilgrimage concluded at Refuge Coffee's annual Spring Market, a community celebration in the heart of "the most diverse square mile in America."

Making a Difference



Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

As we celebrate the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary on May 31st, let us reflect on the words of Pope Francis' Apostolic Journey To Romania in 2019.

Pope Francis reminds us that ".... from Nazareth to the house of Zechariah and Elizabeth was the first of Mary's Journeys, as related by the Scriptures. She will journey from Galilee to Bethlehem, where Jesus will be born; she will go down to Egypt to save her Child from Herod; she will go up again every year to Jerusalem for the Passover (LK2:31), and ultimately she will follow Jesus to Calvary. These journeys all have one thing in common: they were never easy; they always required courage and patience. They tell us that Our Lady knows what it means to walk uphill, she know what it means for us to walk uphill, and she is our sister at every step of the way. She knows what it is to be weary of walking and she can take us by the hand amid our difficulties, in most perilous twists and turns in our life's journey."

Since the first celebration in 1972, World Environment Day has helped UNEP (United Nations Environment Programme) to raise awareness and generate political momentum around growing concerns, such as the depletion of the ozone layer, toxic chemicals, desertification and global warming.
