Pope Francis, pray for us. Mary, Mother of Sorrows, comfort us. Amen.

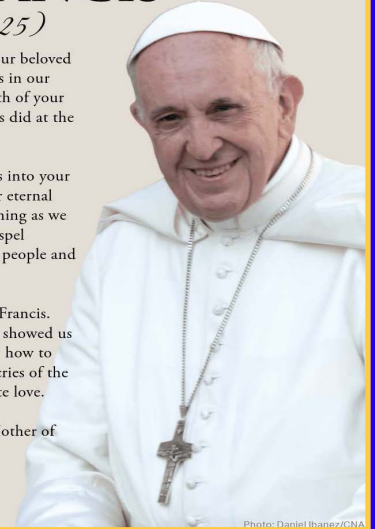

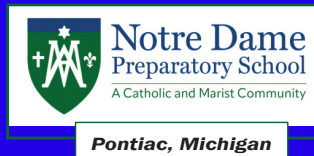


An Evening to Support Reach for Excellence

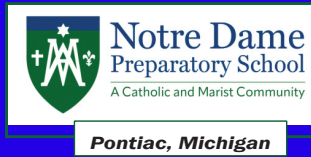


First Communicants
