


#### Culmination of the Season of Creation: A New Beginning





#### **World Mission Sunday**

World Mission Sunday was established by Pope Pius XI in 1926. It is usually observed on the third Sunday of October and will be celebrated this year on October 19th.

This year's theme that resonates deeply in this Jubilee Year: "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples." In his message, the Holy Father stated that this day is an opportunity for the entire Catholic Church to unite in prayer for missionaries "and for the fruitfulness of their apostolic labors." He reminds us that hope is at the heart of the Christian mission, calling every baptized person to be "messengers and builders of hope" in a world that often finds itself overshadowed by uncertainty and despair.
