On October 2nd, the entire Marist School community gathered in Young Gym to celebrate Founders Day Mass, marking 124 years of excellence in Catholic education in Atlanta. The celebration included a joyful, spontaneous rendition of "Happy Birthday" to Marist School, a fitting tribute to a legacy that began in 1901 and continues to thrive.

In his homily, School Chaplain Father John Ulrich, S.M. reflected: "We celebrate Founders Day to remember that day 124 years ago when our beloved school opened its doors. We give thanks for the insight of those early Marist Fathers and for the generosity of so many who have helped our school flourish. We give thanks to almighty God for the blessings on our school and all our endeavors, and we give thanks to Blessed Mother Mary for calling each of us, by gracious choice, to be part of her school. We are grateful that we are and remain Sub Mariae Nomine—under the name of Mary."

The Mass also honored the election of Rev. Prof. Declan Marmion, S.M. as the 15th Superior General of the Society of Mary and recognized the Feast of the Guardian Angels.









On September 26th, Marist School 9th graders stepped away from the classroom and into a day of discovery, community, and service during Camp 3790. Designed to build class unity and deepen students' understanding of the Marist Way, the day included both off-campus adventure and meaningful on-campus service. Students began their day at Sojourn Adventures, where they teamed up with senior leaders and faculty to take on fun team challenges. Back on campus, the service portion of Camp 3790 invited students to Kuhrt Gym, where they gathered alongside senior leaders to hear from three speakers about the transformative power of community care. Marist parents of alumni Andy and Lisa Hiles shared the inspiring origin of The Sandwich Project. U.S. Army veteran and current Marist parent Gina Gentile '92 spoke about the healing power of community support for veterans. Marist Community Service Coordinator Mrs. Mary Ujda offered personal insight into the impact of kindness toward seniors in assisted living. Inspired by these stories, students rotated through three hands-on service stations: making sandwiches for local food-insecure neighbors through The Sandwich Project, designing posters to encourage veterans in a residential treatment program for Veterans Day, and creating birthday cards for residents at Sunrise Assisted Living. The day exemplified what it means to be Marist made for others.


